


8 things you didn't know about Vocational Education



The average employment rate among 20 to 34 year-olds with a medium level vocational qualification was 80.5% in 2018.


6.6 % higher than their peers with general qualifications at the same level of education.




Vocational education students have more contact with employers and easier access to recruitment networks.




Vocational education supports disadvantaged students to enter higher-level occupations and prepare citizens to live and work in their communities and society.



Vocational education and training (VET) is expected to reduce the rate of early schoolleavers from education to less than 10%



Vocational education will increase the share of 30–40 years old having completed tertiary or equivalent education to at least 40%



Vocational education represents as much as 23% of the total population in lower income countries in South Asian.
